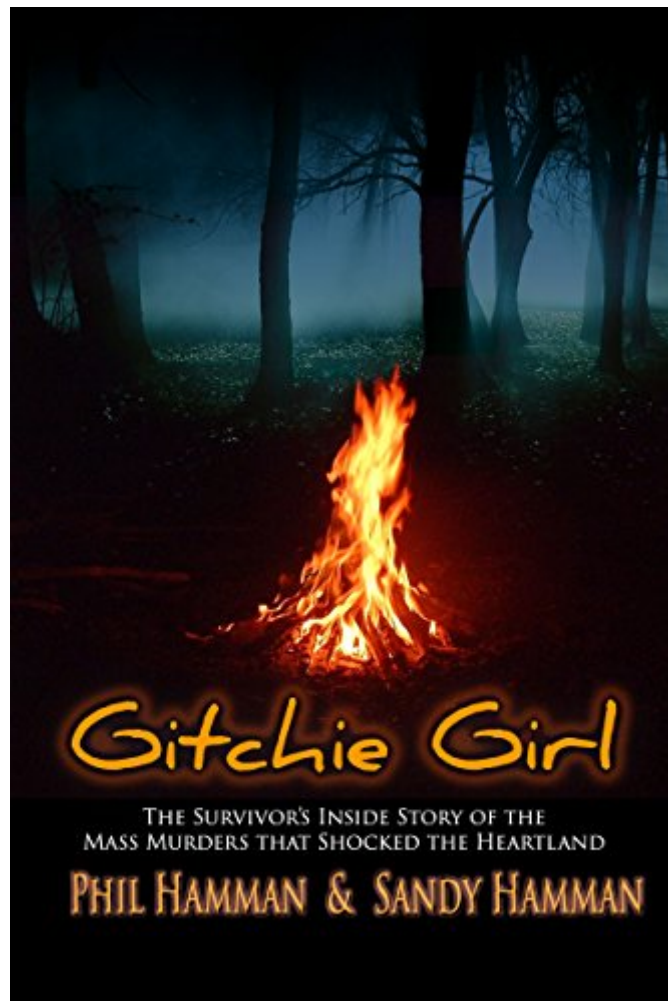

Amazing story of triumph over tragedy. I have read true crime books by the hundred's over thirty five years, and rarely find a subject that I don't have at least some knowledge of the crime. I had no idea what the story would tell, but was intrigued by the title, Gitchie Girl. From the first chapter I was sucked into wanting to know more and where this story going to lead. Although not a long read, 164 pages, it is not short in bringing the reader to the heart of the amazing resilience of a thirteen year old girl. Already wise beyond her years, suddenly forced to step further into adulthood by absolutely no fault of her own. Fear gripped me while reading the further "torture" she endured in order to "help" the investigation.
