But this is Berezovskyâ [™]s story. Abramovich plays a surprisingly small row, arguably less important than Georgian strongman and Berezovskyâ ™s right-hand muscle Badri Patarkatsishvili, former-FSB agent Alexander Litivenko, and Bond villain Russian dictator Vladimir Putin, even Boris Yeltsin and his daughter Tatiana. Berezovsky was one of an early wave of Russians from all walks of lifeâ "he was a half-Jewish former academica "to make his fortune in the wake of perestroika. Berezovsky made his first fortune selling cars bought from the manufacture on credit during a period of gross inflation. From there he moved into TV (his eventual downfall), oil, and aluminum. It was oil that sprang from his initial partnership with Abramovich. Abramovich, already owner of a pipeline, approached Berezovsky with the idea to take a state oil company private, and Berezovsky used his connections to make it happen.
